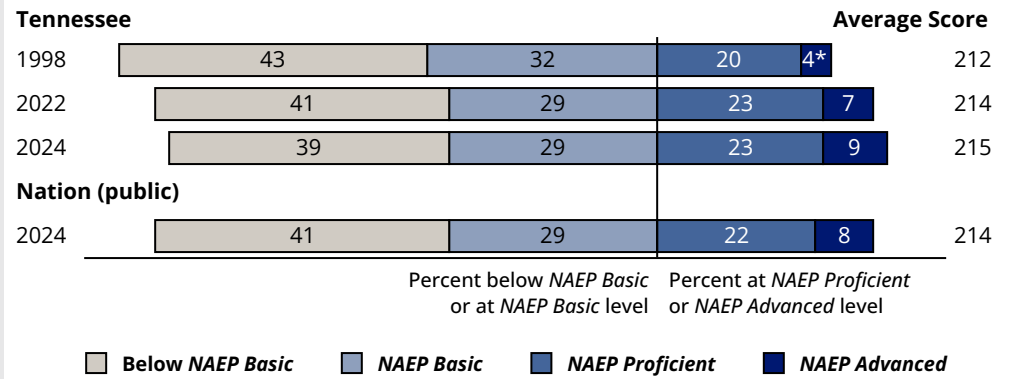


OVERALL RESULTS

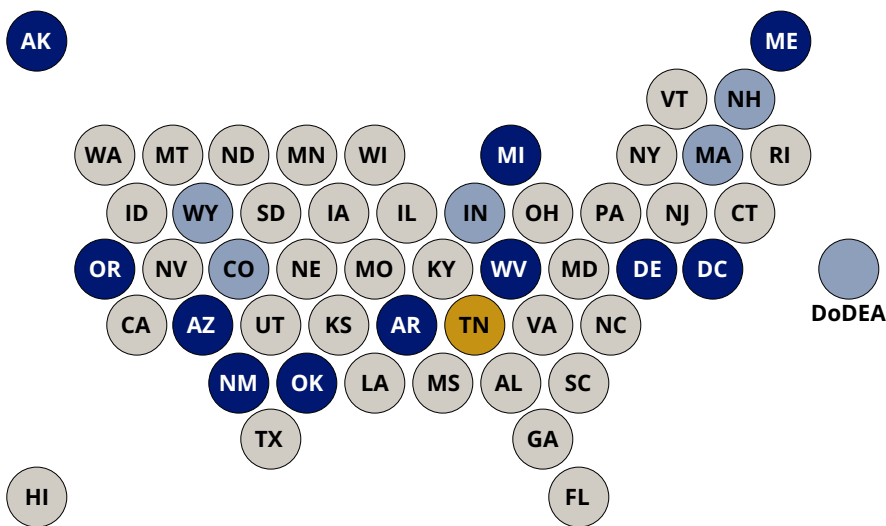
- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Tennessee was 215. This was not significantly different from the average score of 214 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Tennessee in 2024 (215) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (214) and in 1998 (212).
- The percentage of students in Tennessee who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 32 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (30 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (25 percent).
- The percentage of students in Tennessee who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 61 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (59 percent) and in 1998 (57 percent).

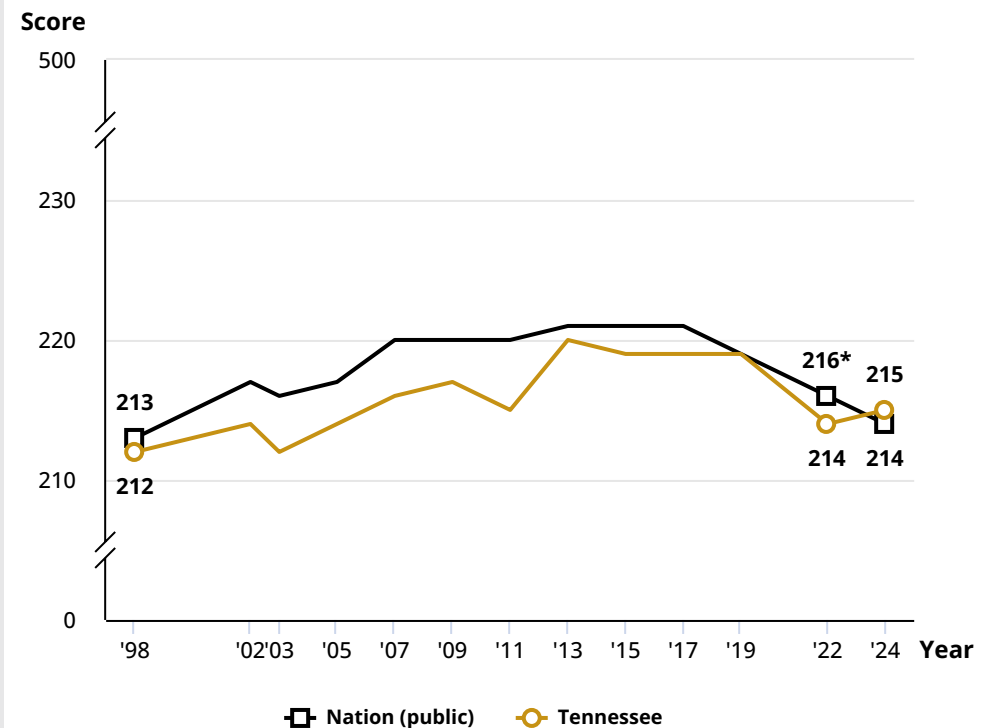
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (25 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 1998, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, male students in Tennessee had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 6 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (26 points).
