

# Basic Data Elements for Elementary and Secondary Education Information Systems

*Basic Data Elements for Elementary and Secondary Education Information Systems* proposes a common language for collecting and reporting education data. It contains recommendations for a set of core student and staff data elements that generate the basic information needed to operate schools and districts, support state and Federal program reporting, and guide education policy at all levels.

The basic data elements will not meet every conceivable information purpose, but their use should result in more comparable and reliable education information within a school, school district, state education agency, or other types of educational units with a need for student and staff information. Use of the basic data elements will also reduce redundancy and minimize data burden.
