Student Financing of Undergraduate Education: 2007–08

In 2007–08, approximately 21 million students were enrolled in undergraduate postsecondary education in the United States. These Web Tables provide a comprehensive source of information on financial aid that was awarded to undergraduate students during the 2007–08 academic year. Included are estimates of tuition, price of attendance, and financial aid, shown by the enrollment and demographic characteristics of students. The tables are similar to those produced for the 1995–96, 1999–2000, and 2003–04 National Postsecondary Student Aid Study (NPSAS) reports on student financing of undergraduate education, and are grouped into five separate sections:

Section 1 displays the percentile distribution among all undergraduates for family income, tuition, and price of attendance. These distributions were used to create the categories for these variables in the subsequent sections.

Section 2 shows undergraduates' average tuition and fees and average price of attendance. The price of attendance includes books and supplies, room and board (or housing and meal allowances for off-campus students), transportation, and other personal living expenses.

Section 3 looks at the various types of financial aid that undergraduates received—federal, state, and institutional aid and combined amounts—by type of institution attended.

Section 4 shows net tuition (tuition and fees minus all grants), net price of attendance (price minus all grants), the out-of-pocket net price (price minus all aid), and financial need.

Section 5 examines students' dependency and attendance status, residence, race/ethnicity, gender, citizenship, family income, and their distribution by the type of institution attended.

DATA

The estimates presented in these tables were generated from the 2007–08 National Postsecondary Student Aid Study (NPSAS:08), a comprehensive, nationally representative survey of how students finance their postsecondary education conducted by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). NPSAS also includes a broad

array of demographic and enrollment characteristics.

NPSAS uses a two-stage sampling design. Institutions are selected for inclusion in the first stage, and from these institutions students are selected in the second stage. The NPSAS:08 target population consisted of all eligible undergraduate and graduate students enrolled any time between July 1, 2007, and June 30, 2008 at Title IV¹ eligible postsecondary institutions in the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. Approximately 114,000 undergraduates and 14,000 graduate students were study respondents for NPSAS:08.

DATA ANALYSIS SYSTEM (DAS)

These estimates were produced using the Data Analysis System (DAS), a web-based software application that enables users to generate tables for most of the postsecondary surveys conducted by NCES. The DAS produces the design-adjusted standard errors necessary for testing the statistical significance of differences between the estimates. The DAS also contains a

detailed description of how each variable was created and includes the wording of questions for variables coming directly from the interview.

With the DAS, users can replicate or expand upon the tables presented here. The output from the DAS includes the parameter estimates (e.g., percentages or means), their standard errors,² and weighted sample sizes. If the number of valid cases is too small (i.e., fewer than 30 cases) to produce a reliable estimate, the DAS prints the message “low-N” instead of the estimate.

In addition to generating tables, DAS users may conduct covariance analyses with either weighted least squares or logistic regression. Many options are available for output with the regression results. For example, a Winsor filter can be used to eliminate cases with extreme values by deleting some cases from the top and bottom of the range.

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ENDNOTES

¹ Title IV institutions are those eligible to participate in the federal financial aid programs included in Title IV of the Higher Education Act. These programs include Pell grants, federal student loans, work-study, and other federal aid.

² NPSAS samples are not simple random samples; therefore, simple random sample techniques for estimating sampling errors cannot be applied to these data. The DAS takes into account the complexity of the sampling procedures and calculates standard errors appropriate for such samples using a bootstrap technique. This technique approximates the estimator by replications of the sampled population.

Glossary

All of the variables that were used in these tables are described in this glossary. The variables were taken directly from the 2007–08 National Postsecondary Student Aid Study (NPSAS:08) Data Analysis System (DAS). The DAS is a web-based application that allows users to create tables with estimates and standard errors from the NPSAS:08 data and other surveys (see the Data Analysis System section for a more detailed description), and it can be accessed at <http://www.nces.ed.gov/das/>. In the glossary, the items are listed in alphabetical order by the variable label. The name of each variable appears to the right of the variable label.

Any campus-based aid

CAMPAMT

Total amount of federal aid received during 2007–08 that is campus-based. Includes the Supplemental Educational Opportunity (SEOG) grant (SEOGAMT), federal college work-study (TFEDWRK), and Perkins loans (PERKAMT), all of which are awarded on the basis of need. Federal campus-based aid is available only at institutions that participate in the campus-based aid programs and is administered directly by the financial aid office at each participating school. The amount of aid received by students depends on the availability of funds at their institution. Schools set their own deadlines for awarding campus-based funds.

Attendance status

ATTNSTAT

Number of months enrolled full time or part time at all institutions attended during the 2007–08 academic year. In some cases, only full-time, full-year students who attended one institution were included to allow for comparisons in tuition, price of attendance, and financial aid. Those attending full time generally have higher overall expenses than do all students. They also generally qualify for federal aid and other assistance not available to many part-time students. Full-year is defined as enrollment for 9 or more months during the NPSAS year. Months did not have to be contiguous or at the same institution, and students did not have to be enrolled for a full month in order to be considered enrolled for that month. Full-time is usually defined as 12 or more credit hours. The categories are as follows:

All other students under 24 were considered to be dependent unless they could document that they were receiving no parental support and were determined to be independent by a financial aid officer using professional judgment.

Dependent students' parent income

DEPINC

For dependent undergraduates, this is the total income of the student's parents in 2006. Prior calendar year income is reported in the federal financial aid application and is used in determining the expected family contribution (EFC) in federal need analysis. That is, 2006 income was used to determine financial aid eligibility for the 2007–08 academic year.

Federal aid total

TFEDAID

Total amount of federal financial aid received in 2007–08. This includes federal grants, federal student loans, federal work-study, and federal Parent PLUS loans. It does not include federal tax benefits, federal veterans benefits, or Department of Defense programs.

Federal expected family contribution

EFC

The federal expected family contribution (EFC) used in federal need analysis is an estimate of the amount that students and parents should be able to contribute toward educational expenses. A zero EFC means that the student and family cannot afford to contribute any amount. Students with a zero EFC are eligible for a maximum Pell grant (\$4,310 in 2007–08). The EFC is calculated by taking into account a family's income, assets, family size, number of children in college, and other factors affecting the ability to pay for a postsecondary education. The income of parents is included in calculating the EFC of dependent students, but not for independent students. EFC values were taken from federal sources for Pell grant recipients and students with federal financial aid application records or from institutional records. If the EFC was not available from any of these sources, it was imputed by regression using dependency, family size, income, and number of children in college. EFC is generally imputed for students who did not apply for or receive any federal aid.

Federal grants

TFEDGRT

Total amount of federal grants received by a student during the 2007–08 academic year. These are Pell grants, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (SEOG), Academic Competitiveness Grants (ACG), Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grants (SMART), Robert Byrd Scholarships, and several smaller federal grant programs received during the 2007–08 academic year. This variable does not include federal tax benefits, federal veterans benefits, or benefits from Department of Defense programs.

Federal loans

TFEDLN

Total amount of federal student loans received by the student during 2007–08. Primarily Stafford loans (subsidized and unsubsidized), Perkins loans, and a small percentage of federal loans through the Public Health Service. Does not include federal Parent PLUS loans. The major sources of loans to students are the Federal Stafford loan programs (see STAFFAMT).

Federal Parent PLUS loans

PLUSAMT

Total amount of federal Parent PLUS loans received in 2007–08. Federal Parent PLUS loans are available to the parents of dependent undergraduates in addition to any federal Stafford loans for which students are eligible. Parent PLUS loans are not based on need; however parents must meet certain creditworthiness criteria in order to take out a loan. There is no fixed limit to the amount of a Parent PLUS loan, but the Parent PLUS loan may not exceed the total price of attendance minus any other financial aid.

Federal Pell grant

PELLAMT

Total amount of federal Pell grants received at all institutions attended during the 2007–08 academic year. Pell grants are need-based grants awarded to undergraduates who have not yet received a bachelor's degree and for students in teaching certificate programs. They are intended as a financial base, to which other financial aid awards can be added. The amount of a Pell grant depends on the expected family contribution (EFC), the price of attendance, and attendance status (full-time or part-time, full-year or part-year). In the 2007–08 academic year the maximum Pell grant was \$4,310.

Federal work-study

TFEDWRK

Total amount of federal work-study aid received by a student in 2007–08. The federal work-study program subsidizes students' wages and is available to students with financial need. Includes institutional matching funds.

Financial need (price of attendance minus EFC)

SNEED1

The student's total need for need-based financial aid as determined by federal need analysis. Equal to the total price of attendance (BUDGETAJ) minus the federal expected family contribution (EFC). The fundamental rule in federal financial aid need analysis is that the student's need is determined by subtracting the EFC from the price of attendance (student budget). If the student's need is zero or negative, the student is not eligible for any need-based federal aid. When the EFC is greater than the price of attendance (and therefore the student has no need), the result is a negative number that has been set to zero. The averages in the tables include only students with positive need values. A student with no federal need may still be eligible for federal non-need-based aid (primarily unsubsidized Stafford loans or Parent PLUS loans). Similarly, a student without federal need may also receive any non-federal grants, loans, or any other aid as long as no federal need-based aid is accepted. Calculated only for students who attended one institution in 2007–08. See the NOTE under NETCST1 for an explanation of the difference between remaining need and net price variable calculations.

Institution type

Control concerns the source of revenue and control of operations (public, private nonprofit, for-profit), and level concerns the highest degree or award offered by the institution in any program. Doctorate-granting institutions award a doctoral or first-professional degree in one or more programs; 4-year non-doctorate-granting institutions award at least a bachelor's degree; 2-year institutions award at least an associate's degree; and less-than-2-year institutions award certificates or other credentials in vocational programs. It should be noted that some community colleges have begun offering bachelor's degrees in a few programs and have been reclassified as 4-year institutions in IPEDS.

The nine categories of types of institutions were used as the sampling frame for the national NPSAS sample. Sampled students determined to have attended more than one institution during the NPSAS study year have been reclassified into a separate category ("More than one institution") because all or part of their financial aid may not have been received at the NPSAS sample institution.

INGRTAMT

Total amount of grant aid received during the 2007–08 academic year that was funded by the postsecondary institution attended. This includes all need- and merit-based grants, scholarships, and tuition waivers from institutional funds.

Institutional loans

INLNAMT

Total amount of all institutional loans (from funds provided by the educational institution) received during the 2007–08 academic year.

Institutional merit-only grants

INSMERIT

Institutional grants and scholarships received during the 2007–08 academic year that were based only on merit rather than need, including all athletic scholarships. Students who receive need-based grants may also receive merit scholarships that are not based on need.

Institutional work-study

INSTWRK

Total amount of all institution-sponsored work-study aid (outside of the federal work-study program) received during the 2007–08 academic year. Includes any institutional amounts that were classified as work-study or campus employment.

Net price after federal grants

NETCST2

The net price of attendance after federal grants received in 2007–08. Equal to the attendance-adjusted student budget (BUDGETAJ) minus all federal grants (TFEDGRT). Federal grants include Pell grants, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (SEOG), Academic Competitiveness Grants (ACG), Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grants (SMART), and a small number of Robert Byrd Scholarships. They do not include federal veterans benefits or education tax benefits. All students are included in the calculation of the average, whether or not they received any federal grants. For students who did not receive any federal grants, this amount is the same as the price of attendance. Calculated only for students who attended one institution during 2007–08. See the NOTE under NETCST1 for more information.

Net price (price of attendance minus all grants)

NETCST3

The net price of attendance after all grants for the 2007–08 academic year. Equal to the total price of attendance (BUDGETAJ) minus total grant aid from federal, state, institutional, or other sources (TOTGRT). Grants include tuition waivers and employer tuition reimbursements. They do not include federal veterans benefits or military education benefits. All students are included in the calculation of the average, whether or not they received any grant aid. For students who did not receive any grants, this amount is the same as the price of attendance. Calculated only for students who attended one institution during 2007–08. See the NOTE under NETCST1 for more information.

Net tuition (tuition and fees minus all grants)

NETCST9

The net tuition and fees after all grants for 2007–08. Equal to tuition and fees (TUITION2) minus total grant aid from federal, state, institutional, or other sources (TOTGRT). Grants include tuition waivers and employer tuition reimbursements. They do not include federal veterans benefits or military education benefits. All students are included in the calculation of the average, whether or not they received any grant aid. For students who did not receive any grants, this amount is the same as the tuition and fees. Grants help cover the entire price of attendance (not just tuition), so the grant amount may be greater than tuition alone. Negative values (if TOTGRT was greater than TUITION2) were set to zero. The average net tuition shown in the tables includes these zero values. Calculated only for students who attended one institution during 2007–08. See the NOTE under NETCST1 for more information.

Other type of aid

OTHTYPE

Indicates the total amount of aid received during 2007–08 that was not classified as grants, student loans, or work study. Includes Parent PLUS loans, vocational rehabilitation and job training grants, veterans benefits, and benefits from Department of Defense programs. It does not include federal education tax benefits.

Out-of-pocket net price (price of attendance minus total aid)

NETCST1

The net price of attendance after all financial aid received in 2007–08. Equal to the total price of attendance (BUDGETAJ) minus total aid (TOTALID). It represents the estimated “out-of-pocket” expense to students remaining after all financial aid, including loans, is received. All students are included in the calculation of the average, whether or not they received any financial aid. For students who did not receive any financial aid, this amount is the same as the price of attendance. Calculated only for students who attended one institution during 2007–08.

NOTE: Net price of attendance variables are calculated by subtracting financial aid (total or only some types, such as grants) from the price of attendance (the student budget). The net price variables are never less than zero because a basic principle of financial aid is that total aid may not exceed the student budget. Need and remaining need variables subtract the EFC as well as financial aid from the student budget. Because the EFC may be greater than the student budget, need may be negative. Even if the EFC is less than the student budget (so that

Perkins loans

PERKAMT

Total amount of federal Perkins loans received at all institutions attended during the 2007–08 academic year. The Perkins loan is a campus-based, low-interest loan administered by each institution for undergraduate and graduate students who show exceptional financial need. Priority is given to Pell grant recipients. The total annual Perkins loan cannot exceed \$4,000 for undergraduate students and \$6,000 for graduate level students.

Price of attendance

BUDGETAJ

Total educational expenses of the student during the 2007–08 academic year, adjusted for attendance status. The total price of attendance includes the tuition and fees as well as all other expenses related to enrollment: books and supplies, room and board (or housing and meal allowances for off-campus students), transportation, and other personal living expenses. The total price of attendance is based on the student budgets reported by the institutions. Student budgets are prepared by institutional financial aid offices to estimate the typical educational expenses of various types of students (e.g., dependent, independent, on-campus, off-campus, living with parents) and are used as part of the federal need analysis that determines the student’s need for financial aid. For students who attended one institution only.

Race/ethnicity

RACE

Student’s race/ethnicity with Hispanic or Latino origin as a separate category. Based on the 2000 census race categories, but the race categories exclude Hispanic origin unless specified.

American Indian/Alaska Native	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.
Asian	A person having origins in any of the peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent. This includes people from China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, India, and Vietnam.
Black/African American	A person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa.

Remaining need after receiving financial aid (price of attendance minus EFC minus total aid)

SNEED2

The remaining need after all financial aid (need-based and non-need-based) received in 2007–08. Equal to the total price of attendance (BUDGETAJ) minus the federal expected family contribution (EFC) and minus total financial aid (TOTAID). Negative values have been set to zero. The averages in the tables include only students with positive remaining need values after financial aid was subtracted from need (SNEED1). Calculated only for students who attended one institution in 2007–08. See the NOTE under NETCST1 for an explanation of the difference between remaining need and net price variable calculations.

Stafford subsidized

STAFSUB

Total amount of federal subsidized Stafford loans received during the 2007–08 academic year. Subsidized Stafford loans are awarded on the basis of financial need. If a student qualifies for a subsidized loan, the federal government pays the interest on the loan until the student begins repayment, and during authorized periods of deferment thereafter. See STAFFAMT for more information about Stafford loans.

Stafford unsubsidized

STAFUNSB

Total amount of federal unsubsidized Stafford loans received during the 2007–08 academic year. Unsubsidized Stafford loans are not awarded on the basis of need. Students who qualify for an unsubsidized loan are charged interest from the time the loan is disbursed until it is paid in full. Students can choose to pay the interest or allow it to accumulate. If the student allows the interest to accumulate, it will be capitalized (i.e., added to the principal amount of the loan). See STAFFAMT for more information about Stafford loans.

State aid total**STATEAMT**

Total amount of state-funded financial aid received by the student during the 2007–08 academic year. This includes state grants, state loans, state-sponsored work-study, and vocational rehabilitation and job training grants, including any federal Workforce Investment Act (WIA) funds.

State grants**STGTAMT**

Total amount of state-funded grants, scholarships, and fellowships received during the 2007–08 academic year. These include the federal matching funds to states through the Leveraging Education Assistance Partnership (LEAP) program. State grants include both need- and merit-based grant programs.

State loans**STLNAMT**

Total amount of state loans received during 2007–08. These are student loans that are funded by state government agencies.

State merit-only grants**STMERIT**

Total amount of state grants and scholarships received during the 2007–08 academic year that were based only on merit, such as high school grades or admission test scores. Does not include state grants based on both merit and need or special purpose grants that are neither need-based nor merit-based, such as waivers for National Guard or state employees.

State work-study**STWKAMT**

Total amount of state work-study aid received during the 2007–08 academic year.

Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)**SEOGAMT**

Amount of Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) received during the 2007–08 academic year. The SEOG is a federal, campus-based grant (administered by each institution) for undergraduates who have not yet received a bachelor's or first-professional degree, and who show exceptional financial need. It is intended to supplement the Pell grant (priority is given to Pell grant recipients). The maximum SEOG was \$4,000 in 2007–08. However, unlike the Pell grant, eligibility does not guarantee an SEOG award, as the funds available to a particular institution may be limited.

Total aid**TOTAID**

Total amount of financial aid received by a student in 2007–08 from any source except parents, relatives, or friends. It includes any grants, student loans, work-study, Parent PLUS loans, job training funds, and veterans benefits and benefits from Department of Defense programs. It does not include federal tax benefits.

Total grants**TOTGRT**

Total amount of all grants and scholarships received by a student in 2007–08. Grants are a type of financial aid that do not require repayment or employment. This variable is equal to the sum of all federal grants, state grants, institutional grants, and grants from employers or private sources. All need-based grants, merit scholarships, tuition waivers, and employer tuition reimbursements are included.

Total loans**TOTLOAN**

Total amount of all student loans received during the 2007–08 academic year. This variable includes all student loans received through federal, state, institutional, or private programs. A student loan is defined as a type of financial aid that advances funds to a student and is evidenced by a promissory note requiring the recipient to repay the specified amounts under prescribed conditions. It excludes federal Parent PLUS loans and any loans from family or friends.

Total Stafford loan**STAFFAMT**

Total amount of federal subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford loans received either through the Direct Loan program or Federal Family Education Loan Program (FFELP), at all institutions attended during the 2007–08 academic year. Includes loans borrowed to attend schools other than the NPSAS sample school. Annual loan limits for Stafford loans vary by class level and dependency status.

Federal Stafford loans were available in 2007–08 through two different loan programs. Although the source of funds is different, both programs offer the same types of Stafford loans. These programs also offer Parent PLUS (PLUSAMT) and Graduate PLUS (GPLUSAMT) loans.

1. Direct Loan program. Under this program, the federal government makes loans directly to students and parents through postsecondary institutions participating in the Direct loan program. Institutions process the applications and disburse the loans directly to students.
2. Federal Family Education Loan Program (FFELP). Under this program, private lenders such as banks, credit unions, and savings & loan associations process the applications and make the loans to students. The federal government guarantees these loans.

There are two types of federal Stafford loans, both available through the two different loan programs: subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford loans.

1. Subsidized Stafford loan (STAFSUB). These are awarded on the basis of financial need. If a student qualifies for a subsidized loan, the federal government pays the interest on the loan until the student begins repayment, and during authorized periods of deferment thereafter.
2. Unsubsidized Stafford loan (STAFUNSB). These are not awarded on the basis of need. Students who qualify for an unsubsidized loan are charged interest from the time the loan is disbursed until it is paid in full. Students can choose to pay the interest or allow it to accumulate. If the student allows the interest to accumulate, it will be capitalized (i.e., added to the principal amount of the loan).

Total work-study**TOTWKST**

Total amount of work-study aid received during the 2007–08 academic year. This variable includes all federal work-study, state work-study, and institutional work-study aid, including undergraduates who had assistantships, tutoring, dormitory, or advising jobs.

Tuition and fees**TUITION2**

Tuition and fees at the sampled institution for students who attended only one institution during the 2007–08 academic year. Students who attended more than one institution were not included. The tuition as reported by institutions was the primary source, edited and adjusted for attendance status if necessary. If tuition data were not available from institutions, they were taken from the most recent IPEDS report and adjusted for attendance status. The tuition and fees categories are as follows:
